## Minimum Standard Data - Swift & Sure Sanctions Program

The State Court Administrative Office requires that courts participating in the Swift & Sure Sanctions Pilot Program (SSSPP) collect certain data on probationers in the program. The information collected must include a minimum standard data set developed and specified by the State Court Administrative Office. The minimum standard data sets include the minimum data that must be reported to the State Court Administrative Office on an annual basis.

The minimum standard data that follows is broken into two sets; one set for screening and one set for case management data relevant to accepted participants. This document provides descriptions and valid values for each of the variables in the minimum standard data sets.
